My prayer list is long.

In the midst of it all there is encouragement, too. Mr. Rogers said, "Look for the helpers." So I give thanks for: the army of volunteers who work in the Dinners-to-Go program, serving well over 29,000 meals (What a blessing to so many in Bartow County!); the people who have donated over \$81,000 to buy the food; our local restaurants who have participated in providing meals; this congregation's faithfulness in giving (The 1st quarter financial report showed pledged giving was 25.4% for the year. Right where we want it to be.); our local civic leaders who continue to give wise leadership during the pandemic; our staff who continue to work to provide worship opportunities, care, and support under difficult circumstances and for the gratitude expressed by many in the congregation for their work.

Jesus said, "I have overcome the world." That is our hope. In the meantime, we plan and prepare for the day when it will be safe to return to work, to school, and play. There are still things we do not know related to coronavirus and we appreciate your patience as we navigate these circumstances and determine what is best. The Session has decided to suspend all church activities until May 19th, when they will meet again to decide the next steps. Live streaming worship services on Facebook will continue each Sunday at 11:00 AM. We pray and look forward to the day when we will gather again.

# From the Session

#### The Session met on April 21, 2020 for its regular Stated Meeting. The following are the highlights from that meeting:

1. Mike introduced Andrea Roche to the Session and each Session member introduced themselves to Andrea.

2. Mike reported that the FPC staff is on a staggered schedule with the office remaining closed to walk-in traffic.

3. Andrea Roche will preach on 5/3/2020 via Facebook Live.

4. FPC has opened a Zoom account which can be used by Committees as needed. Ask Mike for Login credentials.

5. A Blood Drive is planned for 5/13/2020 at FPC from 9 AM until 2 PM.

6. The Preschool Board has applied for a forgivable Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) loan to cover the unfunded teacher payroll.

7. Paul Green provided a Quarterly Report from the FPC Endowment Committee.

8. Andrea Roche reported on her first 21 days as FPC Interim Director of Youth & Children's Ministries.

9. Paul Green reported that the FPC Budget is in good shape in spite of COVID-19.

10. Katie Godfrey reported that the PNC is meeting weekly via Zoom and has reviewed about 140 resumes and conducted two interviews.

11. The Session voted to suspend services and activities in the FPC building through May 19, 2020.

#### Update from the Pastor Nominating Committee

We've been meeting weekly via Zoom for the past month or so reviewing Pastor Information Forms (PIFs). We've received about 120 so far and have identified several good prospects. We began face to face interviews (via Zoom) last week. We anticipate this phase of our search might take several weeks or more. We plan on continuing to request more PIFs even while we're conducting the interviews, just to be sure we aren't missing anyone.
