The Season of Epiphany

"When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

#### Matthew 2:10-11

When the wisemen or, as they are also known as, magi, found the Christ child, they were overwhelmed with joy, they worshipped, and they made offerings to God. There is no better model for Epiphany living than this. Epiphany is often used to refer to any revelation, but for people of faith, when used specifically about this season, it refers to the time when the magi encountered Christ. Like the magi, we too, have encountered Christ throughout the season of Advent and Christmas.

How does that encounter with our Savior affect us for this season of Epiphany? Like the magi, we can name the joy that comes from knowing Christ, we can worship, and we can make our offerings to God.

These days, all of those practices might look a little different than we may imagine. But this does not mean they are unimportant. As a matter of fact, it means they are all the more important.

In this season of Epiphany, I invite us all to take time and energy to name the joys that we have experienced through knowing Christ. We can name that joy in prayer or conversation (on the phone, via zoom, or in person with distancing and masks) with a trusted friend. We may be a powerful witness for Christ to a friend who needs to hear about what it means to know Christ.

Also, whether it is through online worship or in person, we can make worship a priority. And, we can make an offering to God. Whether it is a financial offering or one of time or talents or offering our hearts and lives to Christ to be used to proclaim the good news, there are many ways we can offer our treasures to God. There are opportunities in this season to serve. Consider helping as an usher or exploring being on the Mission, Faith Development, Properties, Worship, or Administration Committees. Invite others to be a part of our community through worship or study or service.

Over the next few weeks, we will be sharing more about the work for Christ that goes on at FPC and inviting everyone to consider how we can be a part of that work. The season of Epiphany is a special time when we, like the magi, can grow in our faith and discipleship. May we all venture out with the wisemen to do just that.


## **Congregational Meeting**

The Session met on December 15, 2020 for its regular Stated Meeting. The following are the highlights from that meeting:

1. Session Meetings will be held via Zoom for the immediate future.

- 2. The FPC Landscaping contract has been renewed for an additional 12 months.
- 3. The FPC Janitorial services contract has been renewed for an additional 6 months.
- 4. A Nursery Worker contract was reviewed and approved.
- 5. A second nursery worker has been hired.
- 6. The Annual Meeting of the congregation will take place on 1/31/2021.

7. Beth Gaines reported that 17, 30, and 28 respectively have already signed up for the 5:00, 7:00,

and 9:00 Christmas Eve Services.
