[The Lord said] "Go out!" But be careful—this is hazardous work. You're like lambs in a wolf pack. Carry no wallet, no bag, and no sandals. Don't even greet anyone along the way."

Luke 10:3-4 (My translation)

"It is madness to wear ladies' velvet hats to church. We should all be wearing crash helmets." Annie Dillard.

Discipleship has always been a bumpy road. When Jesus said, "Take up your cross and follow me," he was reminding us all that discipleship comes with challenges. He echoed that same thought as he commissioned his disciples to go out into the world. As we enter into this New Year, we too, are commissioned by our Savior, to go out. And his words about the challenge of the journey are also true.

There is little we know for sure about the coming year. How can we meet the needs of people in the midst of the uncertainty and challenges presented by the pandemic? What will fundamental acts of faith such as worship, service or growing as disciples look like? There are many questions and few definite answers so considering how we should shape our ministry in the coming year can be challenging.


In an article about New Year's Resolutions, Pastor Michael Adam Beck shared that his New Year's Resolution for his congregation is: Just Keep Trying Stuff! (The article is very interesting, check it out at: https://www.ministrymatters.com/all/entry/11124/resolved-for-2022-just-keep-trying-stuff)
The phrase is neither eloquent, nor catchy, but it presents a way forward for the church in the midst of these times.

Beck offers five keys to this strategy: **First**: Including both insiders and outsiders in our worship, work, and reflection. **Second**: Recognizing that short-range planning has taken the place of long-range planning and invest in short-range planning. **Third**: Caring for the center while being open to experimenting at the edges, **Fourth**: Being willing to try and fail and understanding that there will always be questions and we may not have all the answers as we go forward. **Fifth**: For those times when we fail, fail forward, because the only true failure is not learning from our failures. Beck concludes: "The story of Christianity is the story of human beings failing forward in a God of grace."

I think the greatest failure would be to fail to go. Christ's command is clear. We are sent out to proclaim Him to the world. Christ is realistic about the challenges we face, but confident, not in our abilities, but in the presence and power of our God. With God by our side, let's put on our crash helmets and go so that we can proclaim God's love to a world that desperately needs to know Christ.

A FAITH OF YOUR OWN: Naming What You Really Believe
