The Best Laid Plans . . .

I know what I'm doing. I have it all planned out - plans to take care of you, not abandon you, plans to give you the future you hope for. Jeremiah 29:11 (The Message)

The best laid plans of mice and men often go awry. Saying adapted from a line in "To a Mouse," by Robert Burns.

I am a planner. I love to make plans. January is often a month for plans. I focus on year long goals and I actually make notes in my calendar about plans for when and how I will accomplish those goals.

February is the month when I begin to realize that some of my plans may not work out exactly as I had hoped. Sometimes, I think if I just work hard enough, it will all fall into place. Other times I throw up my hands and go, "it's chaos now, I should just surrender!" I am not sure if either response is a faithful one.

Making plans is a faithful exercise. It should involve prayer and listening and prayer and discernment and conversation and prayer. Working to see those plans realized is also faithful because discipleship involves work. But, there is a point when we need to stop rowing the boat and open our sails for the Holy Spirit. Rev. Joan Gray uses this analogy about the church in her book about being a Sailboat church, a church that is led, guided and powered by the Holy Spirit.

Gray writes: "Sailboat churches tend to focus not on their own situation, resources, or limitations but rather on discerning God's unfolding will. They engage in intimate partnership with God, trusting God to provide and do what only God can do."

Our Session is currently reading this book and our Session will be praying the 40 days of prayer from the book during Lent. As I have read the book, I have thought about the plans we make and how sometimes God steps in and says, "I know what I am doing. I have it all planned out."

Our plans are important, but there are times when we need to step back and recognize that God has plans for us all. Then, we open our sails and align our hearts and lives with God's plans and our plans fit into God's plans. This requires nimble feet, as we walk along the path of discipleship. It also requires frequent prayer and listening and prayer and discernment and conversation and prayer!

February can be a month of anxiety for those of us who are planners because we begin to realize that things may not be working out exactly as we planned. But, we can take a deep breath, breathing in the Holy Spirit, and recognize that God "through the power at work within us can do abundantly far more than we could ever ask or imagine" (Eph. 3:21).

- 8. An Endowment Committee Report was received.
- 9. Stewardship & Finance reported a 2021 year end surplus of \$26,597.26.

Booth Western Art Activities






Our students and teachers have missed gathering for Chapel each week but Mrs. Turner has found a way to get a little Bible study into her weekly lessons. Using this
