Whether you have children or grandchildren, nieces and nephews going back to school or you are simply looking around in shock at the back to school supplies at Target and remembering that sinking feeling you had as a child, you may have noticed that it is that time of year for children and youth. And just like that: Poof! Summer was gone. I cannot believe that it is time for school already.

For some this is a particularly meaningful transition, such as first time to school for younger children or sending a child to college and thinking, "where did the time go?" For others it is a somewhat normal transition of heading to another year of school. For some, it is more of a "remember when" moment

and recognizing that change is in the air as we resume Fall activities such as regular group meetings (Sunday School, Women's groups, etc) and Football.

Regardless, change of one kind or another is in the air. Change, no matter what shape or form it takes, can be challenging. There is an element of saying goodbye and mourning in any change. As school resumes, I am saying goodbye to and mourning being able to sleep in until 7:00 AM!

But, with many changes, there is a much more profound element to that mourning. Any change comes with loss and as people of faith, we can name that loss and lift it to God. Psalm 86 is one of my favorite psalms and it speaks to bringing our losses to God: "Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me, for I am poor and needy. Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer; listen to my cry of supplication. In the day of my trouble I call on you."

Also, though, change can bring new opportunities. I am very excited about the new opportunities for service (Friendship table), for growing in Christ (bible studies, small groups and the Follow Me congregational study) that are coming with the Fall. Scripture has a great deal to say about this as well. If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation! (2 Corinthians) See I am doing a new thing. Do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland (Isaiah). In the midst of change, God is at work, opening new opportunities, calling us to immerse ourselves in the renewal of our Savior, and calling us to step into the future God intends for us.

Ultimately, times of change bring a bevy of mixed feelings! Paul's words speak most profoundly to such times: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4)



### From the Session:

### The Session did not meet in July, however the following activity was reported:

1. David Dundee (Chair), Sean Ireland, Patrick Gardner, Rhonda Gaffoglio and Courtney Keen were elected 7/10/2022 by the congregation to serve on the 2022 Officer Nominating Committee.

- 2. A committee that includes Scott Panter, Beth Gaines, Betty Dundee, Leigh Jones, and a current Hands of Christ Board member were appointed by the Session to gather information and make recommendations regarding the HOC ministry.
- 3. The CPU board associated with the fire alarm/sprinkler system was recently struck by lightning. The repair cost is estimated at about \$13,000 which has been approved by both the Properties and Finance Committees.

### From Stewardship and Finance:

Halfway through the year our pledges are coming in at 50.7% and total expenses are running at 47.4%. We had some lightning damage in the education wing which will stress our properties budget but overall we are in pretty good financial shape. Thank you everyone for your generosity and continued faithful support.
