



This past weekend, we welcomed Rev. Joan Gray, former moderator of the PCUSA, pastor, and author to help us draw our Session retreat to a conclusion. She spoke about one of her books, *Sailboat Church*, which the Session has been studying this year. I think that I can speak for everyone who was there when I say the time was holy and life-giving and inspiring.

The book reminds us that the church is meant to be a sailboat, with our sails open to the power of the Holy Spirit. We are not a rowboat, where it is all up to us to row in order to get us where we are going. Where we are going is wherever God is leading us and to follow that path, we must open our hearts and our sails so that the Spirit can guide, direct, and power us.

Rev. Gray shared some characteristics of God-powered churches. God-powered churches experience church as a divine-human partnership and make nurturing a relationship with God a top priority. God-powered churches are Spirit-powered and live by prayer. God-powered churches take spiritual realties and resources seriously. God-powered churches live to sail, to do God's will by the power of the Spirit out in the world as well as inside the church. God powered churches teach and practice discernment which shapes our common life. God-powered congregations discover that coming at decisions through seeking God's will shapes them into being more Godly in their life and mission. (Joan S. Gray, God-powered Church, WJKP).

Her words are both encouraging and challenging! Our confidence is in God and we should live that way! Many times we drag down our sails and pull out our oars thinking we can row our way through the tasks of our lives and even the work of the church. But, we must recognize that it is God's power at work within us that is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine. As we welcome new officers this month and look toward all that God is calling us to do for the coming year, let us commit to opening our sails and sailing.
