Then Jesus said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. Luke 9:23

Many times we hear these words that Jesus says to us all and focus on either the part that says "let them deny themselves" or the part that says "take up their cross." Both parts are essential for discipleship. Yet, I think that there's another important word that is often overlooked: Daily. Do we practice the essentials of our faith daily? Do we wake up each morning and ask God to help us to deny selfish ways and to follow Jesus in all that we do for that day?

Adam Hamilton, in his book that we are studying this Lent, The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life, challenges us to start each day on our knees or in some prayerful posture and say to God, "Here I am, Lord, do with me whatever you want." Such a practice helps us to understand that discipleship is shaped by our daily practices. I appreciate Hamilton's easy to model suggestions about the practices of discipleship. He offers two fists and one is clenched and represents the 5 essential practices as a community. Together, we worship & pray, study, serve, give, and share. The other fist, with five fingers spread wide, represents the ways we undertake those practices as individuals. We can pray 5 times a day. We read and study 5 verses of Scripture a week or even 5 chapters. We seek to engage in 5 acts of kindness each week. We practice generosity as a rhythm of our lives, seeking to add 5 acts of special generosity a month. And we seek to share our faith with 5 people in a year.

Some days are always better than others when it comes to living into our practices of discipleship and denying our selfish ways and picking up our crosses to follow Jesus. Thank God that each morning we wake up, we are given new mercies and grace, new hope, and a new calling. I pray that we have all learned something from considering these practices and not just learned something, but that we have been able to incorporate concrete practices in our daily lives that help us to walk more closely with God. Even though the season of Lent is drawing to a close, there are other opportunities to continue to learn and grow with these practices. Holy Week is a time to deepen our focus on Christ and all he does for us. We might focus on one of these 5 essential practices for each day of Holy Week, or seek to live into all 5 every day. For the Easter season, we might seek to rejoice in the resurrection by living into lives that are made new in Christ. Every day that is given to us, we can live into God's call to walk more closely with our Savior.

From the Session:

The following are the highlights from the 3/21/2023 Session Meeting:

- 1. Elizabeth Watanabe was Approved as a new member by Transfer of Letter.
- 2. A Love Offering for Pam Radford who is retiring was Approved.
- 3. A Good Friday Service on 4/7/2023 at 12:15 PM in partnership with the Episcopal Church was Approved.
- 4. An Interim Director of Music and Organist Search Committee Task Force was appointed.
- 5. A Men's Breakfast is planned for 4/2/2023 at 9:00 AM.
- 6. The Congregational Life Committee is planning a Pot Luck Lunch in May.
- 7. An Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for 3/26/2023.
- 8. Vacation Bible School this year is scheduled for 7/10-14.
- 9. The FPC Annual Meeting on 5/21/2023 with Pot Luck Lunch was approved.

A Message From Our Session

At their February meeting, the Session approved the budget for the year of 2023. As you are likely aware, the budget this year has presented many conflicting emotions for us all. We give thanks and celebrate the generosity of this congregation's giving. Moved by the Spirit and growing in faith, our congregation's giving increased notably from last year. We have both an increase in giving units and an increase in giving which reflects the depth of growth and faith in this congregation. However, in the past two years, we have mourned the loss of a number of saints and pillars in this congregation, whose giving exceeded \$250,000.

As a result, the Session has had to prayerfully consider our structure, needs, and the future. Our faith, heritage, and polity provides us with the steps to take in order to do just that. Our Book of Order states that the Session shall prepare and adopt a budget (G.3.0205) and the Session accomplishes that through empowering its committees to make recommendations to the Session regarding the matters of the budget. Our Stewardship and Finance committee determined that each committee must reduce their respective budgets by 20%. Each committee met and prayed about these issues and returned recommendations to the Stewardship and Finance Committee. This committee then prayerfully presented recommendations to the Session.

The Session then, with prayer, humility, and faith, made decisions about these recommendations. A portion of those recommendations included changing the structure of some of the staff positions in the church. Our Book of Order specifically gives the responsibility of managing the structure of the staff and employing the staff to the Session (G-3.0201). Again, the Session accomplishes that through the work of committees and their recommendations. Upon the recommendation of the Personnel Committee and the endorsement of Stewardship and Finance, the Session adopted a budget which makes the position of Sexton a half-time position with full medical benefits and the position of Director of Music/Organist a 3/5 time position with full pension benefits.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to Mark Bridges, our Stewardship and Finance Chair; Peter Olson our Personnel/Stewardship & Finance Elder; or me. I encourage you to reach out to these individuals rather than seeking information from other sources. Going directly to our leaders for information ensures that you receive accurate information and have the opportunity to pray with and for our congregation and especially our leaders. It also ensures that we are doing everything we can to build up and maintain the unity of the body of Christ in this community.

As a Session we will continue, as always, to pray for our community and to ask for the Spirit to be our guide and our sustainer. We pray for the power and presence of our Savior to fill our hearts and that we may proclaim Christ's love and live as his hands and feet in this community and beyond.

Update from the Worship Committee Regarding Our Music Ministry

As you may be aware, Pam Radford is retiring as our FPC organist and director of music ministries, effective April 9. We give thanks for Pam's ministry with us and for the many ways her incredible gifts have touched us all through her worship leadership. The Session has approved an opportunity for any who wish to contribute to a thank you offering for Pam. You may do so by writing a check or offering cash in an envelope or giving online. Please make sure to designate the offering "thank you gift for Pam."

In an ongoing effort to be open and transparent and to ensure that accurate information is available, we are sharing with you the tentative process and timeline for the next several months. As always, we encourage anyone who has questions about any aspects of this process to direct them to the Session, whose leadership areas are noted below.

- An interim task force, composed of Beth Gaines, Leigh Jones, Karen Russell, and Robert Sims, and has begun meeting this week to initiate conversations with possible interims for choir and hand bell director, and organist or accompanist. That task force, pursuant to the Book of Order, will take recommendations to the Personnel Committee which will then make a recommendation to the Session, as the Session makes all employment decisions regarding church staff. The Session will then make a decision regarding the hiring of any new employees.
- Supply accompanists will play in worship on April 16 and April 23.
- Target date: week of April 24 for interim(s) to begin work at FPC, with choir rehearsal on Wednesday, April 26, and first Sunday in worship April 30.
- After interim(s) is/are in place, a search committee composed of members from the worship committee, the personnel committee, church staff, the choir and bell choir, and the congregation at large, will be formed to discern our congregation's needs and resources and to begin searching for permanent music staff. This may be one staff person or more than one person. This will include staff who will support our continued tradition of excellence in music in worship, including organ music.

Target date of having new permanent music staff member(s) on board by August 13, 2023.

These dates are tentative and are dependent upon our prayers, our conversations within this community, and some factors that are beyond our control. But our confidence is in Jesus Christ. Please join us as we continue to pray for our congregation, for Pam and her family, for our music ministry, and for the person or persons that God is calling to serve next with us in music ministry. The music ministry at FPC is an important and valued part of our worship life together, and it is important to us that it continues to be a vibrant and active ministry. Change can be challenging and stressful, but it is also an opportunity for growth and for exciting new beginnings.
