

Leftovers

"And all ate and were filled; and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish." Mark 6:43

I love leftovers. I realize that leftovers have mixed reception for many. Many people do not care for leftovers. But I love them. To me leftovers are the gift that keeps on giving - I get another great meal and don't have to do any of the work! I think Jesus is a fan of leftovers, too. He fed 5,000 people with five loaves and two fish and there were still twelve baskets of leftovers. There was more than enough to go around. I have been thinking about Jesus and those leftovers ever since Youth Sunday this past month. The theme was "More than enough," and the Scripture was the feeding of the five thousand from Mark's Gospel. Throughout the worship service, the youth reminded us that in Christ, we are more than enough. Many times in life and in the church, we may think in terms of scarcity - there are limited resources, limited energies, limited hope, even. But, God's abundant love that we know in Christ is more than enough. In Christ we are not only given all that we need but there are leftovers to share. Christ's love fills our hearts and overflows in our lives. Sometimes, our anger, our fears, our frustrations, or our lack of control in this world can make us feel small and we feel like there is not enough. But Christ is more than enough and in and through his love, we know not only is there enough, there is love and hope and joy to share. In worship on Youth Sunday, the youth shared a poem. It says:

Christ is more than enough Generous in patience Plentiful in mercy Lavish in forgiving sins Washing away our iniquities Just for His name sake

Christ is more than enough Has authority over all situations Is master over all positions The devil is not a match The grave could not keep him Death could not stop Him Christ is more than enough He is my shepherd He is my fortress My shield and rock My savior and redeemer God above all

Christ is more than enough He is my provider He is my healer My guard and guide My all in all.

Christ is more than enough. In Him, we can be fed and there will be the kind of leftovers that everyone loves. Let us give thanks for our Savior and that in him, we, too, are more than enough.

3. Jim Stanley was hired as Interim Choir Director and will begin 4/26/2023.

4. Scott Panter reported that the HOC transition to the Cartersville School System is progressing.

5. Suzanne Collins of Congregational Care reported that over 30 April birthday cards have been mailed.

6, Kathy Farnon of Congregational Life reported that a pot-luck lunch is planned for 5/21/2023 and a Men's Breakfast on 5/7/2023 at 9 AM in the Fellowship Hall.

Our Interim Choir Director, Mr. Jim Stanley

On April 18th, the Session approved the recommendation of the Interim Task Force and Personnel Committee to hire Mr. Stanley as the interim choir director. Mr. Stanley is originally from Blue Ridge, Georgia (where the majority of his family still resides), but he has been a resident of Cartersville since moving here in '95 after accepting the position as choral music teacher at Cartersville High. Prior to that, he was the

choral director for Rome Middle and Rome High Schools. Mr. Stanley is a graduate of Shorter College (now Shorter University) where he earned his Bachelor of Music Education, majoring in voice and minoring in piano and English. He has a Master of Education degree from Walden University and a Specialist in Education from Lincoln Memorial University.

Mr. Stanley's past church music experience includes South Broad United Methodist Church in Rome (pianist/choir director 1990-1994), Rome First United Methodist (youth and children's choirs director, adult choir paid singer 1994-1997), and Sam Jones Methodist (director of music ministries 1997-03, 2011-21).

Our Interim organist/pianist, Mr. Fred Drifmeyer

Fred W. Drifmeyer graduated with a Bachelor of Music Education Degree from Boston University and earned a Master of Music Degree from Hart College of Music at the University of Hartford in Connecticut. He was employed as a music educator in the state of Massachusetts for 37 years before retiring. During his career Fred also directed the Cape Cod Community College Chorus and Chamber Choir, was a member of the Cape Cod Conservatory piano faculty, and directed a semi-professional group, The MasterSingers of Cape Cod. Most recently he was the Director of Music and organist at the Pilgrim Congregationalist Church in Harwich Port, MA.

Fred and his wife Alice moved to Georgia to be closer to family.
