In this Fall season, I invite us all, disciples of every age and stage to consider the covenant. What one speaks most profoundly to you? What one can you work on some more? What one makes you most uncomfortable? Pray about it and ask God to help us all identify ways we can grow into these ideals as we seek to grow into Christ and build each other up in love.

#### **Congregational Meeting for the Purpose of Electing Officers**



Observe the One minute of Silence with Us following the Tolling of the Bell.

Every year as part of the official commemoration ceremony held at the World Trade Center for victims' families, we observe six moments of silence marking the key events of 9/11. In 2023, First Presbyterian Church rang its bell at each of the key milestones. We plan to do it again in 2024.

The Milestones;

• **8:46 a.m.**: Hijackers deliberately crashed American Airlines Flight 11 into floors 93 through 99 of the North Tower. **Tolling of the bell at 7 rings.** 

• **9:03 a.m.**: Hijackers deliberately crashed United Airlines Flight 175 into floors 77 through 85 of the South Tower. **Tolling of the bell at 7 rings.** 

• **9:37 a.m.**: Hijackers deliberately crashed American Airlines Flight 77 into the Pentagon, near Washington, D.C. **Tolling of the bell at 7 rings.** 

• 9:59 a.m.: The South Tower collapsed. Tolling of the bell to include First Responders at 4 segments of 5 rings Each segment.

• **10:03 a.m.**: After learning of the other attacks, passengers on United Airlines Flight 93 launched a counterattack on hijackers aboard their plane to try to seize control of the aircraft. In response, the hijackers crashed the plane into an empty field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. **Tolling of the bell at 7 rings.** 

**10:28 a.m.**: The North Tower collapsed, leaving the 16-acre World Trade Center site in ruins and collateral damage affecting all adjacent properties and streets. The rescue effort commenced immediately. **Tolling of the bell to include First Responders at 4 segments of 5 rings Each segment.** 

#### Bell Tolling

At each milestone following the Tolling of the Bell, one minute of silent reflection will be observed.

• Called a congregational meeting for Sept. 8 following worship for the purpose of hearing a report from the Officer Nominating Committee and electing officers.


• Approved use of a first-floor classroom in the main building on Tuesday afternoons by a women's AA group.
