FOR THE BEGINNING

Our theme for this Advent is "Words for the Beginning." Advent is a season of beginnings and endings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on and the beginnings and endings continue day in and day out. Sometimes endings and beginnings are joyful. Other times they are devastating. Even if an ending and beginning brings great joy, we still grieve change and need time to adjust to the new reality and to what God is calling us to do and be in the new reality.

When we navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words and truths that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown. As we enter this Advent season, we are entering a sacred new chapter, welcoming Christ anew and inviting him to walk with us on our journeys of beginnings and endings. My prayer is that this series will offer us those essential reminders for our journeys of faith.

I find the visuals for this season particularly moving. The art for this series was inspired by the storied tradition of quilting. In a quilt, you can find many beginnings and endings, and sometimes cannot tell one from the other. The beauty and power of the art, as well as the stories, love, and history that is found in quilts, is a powerful statement about our lives of faith.

This theme and the art invite us all to reflect on and pray about the beginnings and endings of this season and in our own journeys. We will have many opportunities to grow in our walk with Christ this Season: From online devotions, to Wednesday words, to Worship that will lift our souls. You can help to add a square for a quilt that is being made for this congregation, and share a quilt for the quilt show or attend the show. You can join the celebration of this season with the Hanging of the Greens and come to the Choir Cantata. You can help serve at Friendship Table or give time, talent, and treasures to support all the ways this congregation shares the love and joy of Christ in this community. Be a part of the FPC quilt!

Quilts are often compilations of pieces of fabrics. I have been told by my quilting friends (I know nothing about how to make quilts, but I sure do



love to enjoy looking at them, using them, and learning about them) that patchwork quilts bring together scraps that have previously been cast off. Some quilts utilize brand new fabric or intricate patterns, and others are made with no pattern in mind from leftover fabric scraps. I think this is a profound analogy for our lives. We take the magnificent pieces and the scraps we would rather toss, and offer it all to God. Like a master quilter, God puts it all together into something beautiful.

For this Advent Season, we are inviting everyone to offer a piece for our congregational quilt. There will be quilt squares and instructions available before worship on Sunday, December 1st, Hanging of the Green on December 4th, and in the church office. Or, if you are a shut in, we can bring a square to you! There are also pens available that you can use to write or draw on the quilt square. Draw a picture, share a few words, or write a verse of Scripture that shares something from your heart about this congregation or this Season.

All squares must returned to the church no later than Sunday, December 8th. Our plan is to have a quilt made that we can dedicate and celebrate on Christmas Eve. If you are an online worshipper, worshiping from afar, you are invited to Facebook message us or call the church office and share a Scripture that is meaningful to you and we will create a square for you!


At a meeting Nov. 2, the Session:

At its stated monthly meeting Nov. 19, the Session took the following actions:


• Welcomed new members Drake and Grace Johnson, who transferred their membership from Calhoun Presbyterian Church.
