Seeing the Lord, Together

When <u>they</u> saw him, <u>they</u> worshipped him - Matthew 28:17
Then <u>their eyes</u> were opened, and <u>they</u> recognized him. Luke 24:31
Then the disciples rejoiced, when they saw the Lord. John 20:20

In this Easter season, the traditional Scripture readings all offer glimpses into the post-resurrection appearances of our Savior. The stories across the gospels are varied (except Mark which has no post-resurrection stories), but they have one thing in common: It is the disciples <u>together</u> who see Christ.

As much as we may think that we can live out our discipleship in a solitary way, the reality is, we all need community. Community supports us, encourages us, and nurtures us. Community offers comfort and opportunities for growth. There are also incredible challenges with being community. We all carry our own brokenness and our own ideas of the way things should work and those inevitably bring us into disagreement within any group.

But being the body of Christ means that there will be times of disagreement. Our covenant of care and respect that our leaders adopt every year states: We accept disagreement and conflict as normal and healthy. In this respect we will seek to deal constructively with disagreements or conflicts by practicing Matthew 18:15-17, Matthew 5:23-24. It also states: We promise to believe the best of each other and give each other the benefit of the doubt. Philippians 4:8-10 And: We promise to walk hand in hand even though we may not always see eye to eye. Colossians 3:14-15.

We cannot be the body of Christ alone. Nor can we truly see the Risen Lord in our midst if we are isolated from the body. I invite all of us in this Easter season to lean into ways we can see the Lord. Let us find opportunities to worship together, serve together, or grow together. Let us find ways to support one another, nurture each other, and embody and experience God's love together. If you would like to pray about or have a conversation about ways you can lean into this season of experiencing Christ together, let me know or speak to your Deacon. Together, may we rejoice each and every time we see our Savior in our midst.


Ladies Night Out Thursday, May 15th at 6:00 pm
